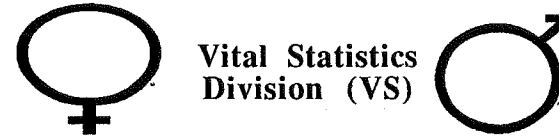

**Vital Statistics
Division (VS)**

The Vital Statistics Division of the Health Department is responsible for the registration, maintenance and storage of all birth and death certificates in Geauga County, Ohio. The attending physician is responsible for filing a birth certificate with the local office and the funeral directors are responsible for filing a certificate for each death that occurs in the County. The local Vital Statistics Registrar is responsible for receipt and storage of these records and the timely transmittal to the Bureau of Vital Statistics of the Ohio Department of Health.

Certified copies of any registered birth or death certificate are made available by the local registrar at a state-mandated charge of seven (7) dollars per copy. Two (2) dollars are remitted to the State of Ohio for each certified copy issued to be used by the Ohio Child Abuse and Child Neglect Fund.

**Public Health Nursing Division
(PHN)**

Public Health Nursing is a specialized function of nursing practice aimed at providing critical preventive health and nursing counseling services to the entire community. Public health nursing is the reinforcement, community assessment and community involvement that prevents health concerns whenever possible and assists in the correction of any problem before it is disruptive to the individual's health, safety and well being.

Public health nursing is a fundamental public service.....largely delivered at the local level.....usually one person at a time.

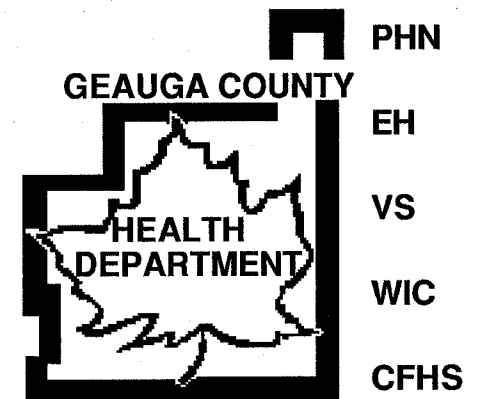
