## GRANT PROGRAMS

### AIDS Prevention Grant

July 1, 1994 - June 30, 1995

The AIDS Prevention Program is funded by a grant from the Geauga Community Board of Mental Health, Alcohol & Drug Addiction Services. The mission of the program is to prevent the spread of AIDS through education and risk reduction services. We have established a committed and active AIDS Consortium with representation from a wide diversity of community organizations and concerned citizens.

### Child and Family Health Services (CFHS)

July 1, 1993 - June 30, 1994

Child and Family Health Services is an Ohio Department of Health program to provide preventive health care for mothers and children. Services are offered on a sliding fee scale based on family size and income and Medicaid is accepted. The Well Child Clinic is staffed by a Certified Pediatric Nurse Practitioner under the supervision of Jung Min Lee, M.D. The Prenatal Clinic is staffed by a Certified Nurse Midwife with Vichai Duangjak, M.D. as the medical advisor. A Licensed Social Worker attends both clinics monthly to assess the needs of the families.

### Early Intervention (EI)

October 1, 1993 - September 30, 1994

This federal grant, passed through the Ohio Department of Health, is to provide parents of children from birth to three years of age with a source of information regarding developmental concerns for their children. The EI program receives supplemental funding from the Geauga County Board of Health and this year a \$6000.00 mini-grant was also awarded to aid in funding.

The Early Intervention Collaborative, representing both parents and professionals, devises a plan for delivery of services according to the needs of the county and directs fund use. Screenings for the early detection of possible speech, hearing, and physical problems are performed on a regular basis.

## GRANT PROGRAMS

### Ohio Children's Trust Fund

July 1, 1993 - June 30, 1994

This grant, provided by the Ohio Department of Human Services, aids programs for the prevention of child abuse and neglect. CFHS uses this fund to contract Ravenwood Mental Health Agency to provide a Licensed Social Worker for the CFHS clinics to do individual or family counseling. The social worker also coordinates a monthly M.O.M.S. support group.

### Women, Infants and Children (WIC)

October 1, 1993 - September 30, 1994

Funded through the United States Department of Agriculture, this federal grant is to provide supplemental food to pregnant, breastfeeding, or postpartum mothers and children from birth to five years of age. Nutritional status is improved by creative nutrition education classes, physical nutritional assessment, and issuance of food coupons to provide nutritious foods and infant formula. Weekly WIC clinics are held in Bainbridge, Middlefield and Chardon and a monthly evening clinic is held in Chardon. WIC employs three health professionals, 2 clerks and 1 lactation consultant.

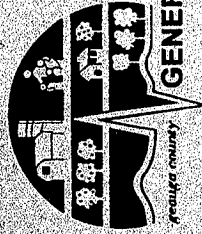
